Dr. Winnie Dunn is a Distinguished Professor at Missouri University School of Health Professions and a Professor at the University of Kansas Medical Center. She serves on numerous professional advisory boards and is actively involved in research. She was awarded a W.T. Kemper Fellowship for Teaching Excellence in September 2004 and recognized as one of the most influential people in occupational therapy. Dr. Dunn's research is directed toward study of how persons understand and use the sensory input they received, and how their sensory processing abilities affect that individual's performance in daily life. Her practice expertise is with children and families in community settings, such as public schools, early intervention programs, day care centers, and families' homes.



Ellen Pope, OTD, OTR/L, Clinical Assistant Professor, is focused on the development of family-based interventions for infants and toddlers with disabilities. Her clinical work is focused on families, infants and toddlers, and international work. Pope has been a member of the KUMC department faculty for over 20 years, teaching about children and families. She has also coordinated a 4-county infant toddler program in Northeast Kansas, provided training and technical assistance to all of the Tiny-K infant toddler programs in the state of Kansas, and served as a member of the Kansas State Coordinating Council on Early Childhood Developmental Services. She also holds licensure as an occupational therapist in Kansas and New Mexico.
